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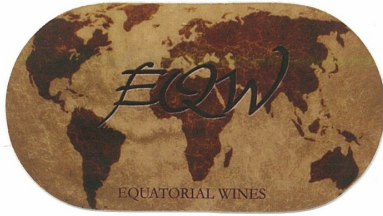

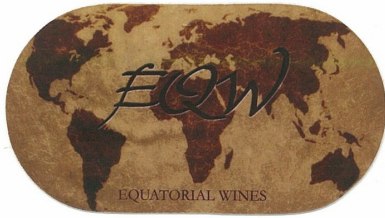


In the land of Gascony, between the Atlantic Ocean and the Pyrenees in south-west France, there is a place like no other.

Yves Grassa, winemaker. Superbly intense for a dry fruity white, its bouquet reveals floral and citrus aromas with nice touches of tropical fruit. Light and well-balanced, this wine is a thirst-quenching pleasure | \$29.00 |
| Sauvignon Blanc 2009 | Gascony's mild climate offers this grape variety a new range of aromas. A distinctive bouquet with fine intense floral notes, some minerality, and the underlying suggestion of ripe grapes. Fresh and refined with an attractive intensity. | Chardonnay 2009 | This fine wine offers delicacy, strength and good structure, having fermented and aged in fine-grained French oak barrels. Its subtle bouquet reveals floral notes, fresh butter and hints of vanilla. Fresh and intense at entry, rich flavours then give way to pleasant toasty notes. Shades of vanilla oak underline the Chardonnay's well-rounded palate and aromatic intensity. | \$31.50 |
| Premieres Grives 2009 | In Gascony, the onset of winter heralds the arrival of the first thrushes ('premières grives'), eager for their share of the season's pickings. Harvested in late autumn, mature grapes packed with sweetness and pleasure produce an elegant wine, with fine typicity. Great fullness on the palate, with delicious tropical flavours, sustained by freshness. | \$36.00 |
| Les 4 Reserves 2008 | Aged on French oak for a year before bottling, this blend consists of four grape varieties, each of which reveals its own aromas on contact with the wood. The result is a whole host of complex, mellow notes ranging from fruity flavours and oaky vanilla to yellow peaches and tropical fruit. Together, they create a wine with good complexity and structure, in which the mellow oak is discreet. | \$32.00 |



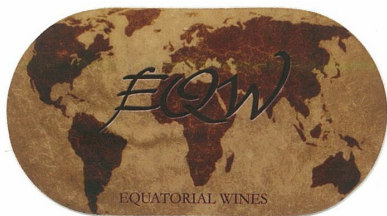

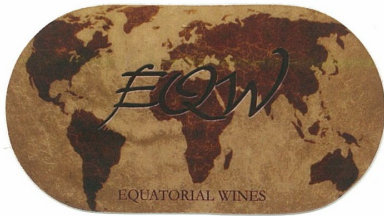

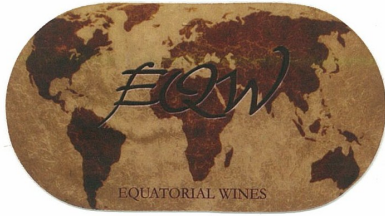
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| Highfield Elstree Cuvee Brut 2007 | <p>Made in Highfield's celebrated Elstree style, extended maturation on the yeast lees has provided some light biscuit aromas which complement the citrus fruit flavours of this elegant Methode Traditionelle. Natural lively acids have mellowed during the maturation process resulting in a fine and delicate mouth-feel with great balance and length</p> | \$52.00 |
| Paua Sauvignon Blanc 2011 | <p>This wine has gooseberry aromas with fresh and intense citrus fruit flavours which combine well with the balanced acidity. The palate is rich and shows granny smith apples, elderflower, lemons and limes. Very refreshing.</p> | \$36.00 |
| Highfield Sauvignon Blanc 2010 | <p>Pungent aromas of gooseberry, freshly cut grass, nettle and hints of tropical fruit. Meticulous grape selection, the use of only free run juice (no pressings), and cold fermentation contribute to an abundant spectrum of herbal and tropical aromas. 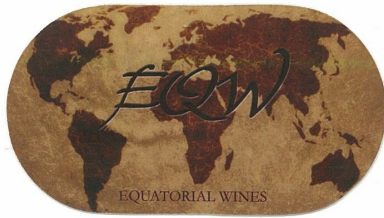

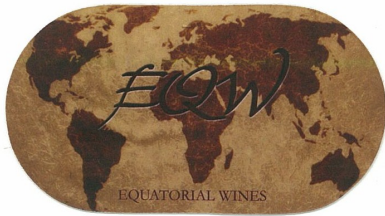

A dark purple color with plush fruit aromas of ripe boysenberry, mocha and warm, spicy cinnamon. Layered flavors of juicy boysenberry, cherry and mocha. | Predator Old Vine Zinfandel 2009 | Predator is an Old Vine Zinfandel from Lodi which is grown and produced without the use of pesticides. A deep ruby red colour with a hint of purple. Aromas of dark fruits dominate the nose with a touch of earthiness and vanilla. Quite brooding and rich. The palate shows big fruit characters, developing into coffee, chocolate and spice. A very well balanced, juicy red wine that has beautiful balance between power and finesse. | \$44.00 |

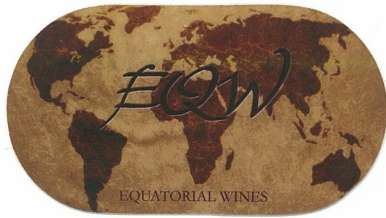

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| Callendale Estate Limestone Coast Shiraz 2009 | The wine has vibrant magenta colour with aromatics of cherry, plum and dark berries complemented by the oak-derived characters of clove and vanilla. The palate is full bodied with dark berry flavours and balanced oak, tannin and acidity. The wine has persistent sweet fruit and oak aftertaste, with power and great finesse. | \$29.50 |
| Callendale Estate Limestone Coast Cabernet Sauvignon 2009 | This wine has a deep lively colour. Strong varietal nose, with cabernet notes of coffee, ripe berries & hints of spicy oak. On the palate, the wine is big, full-bodied with lingering flavours of red berries & spice. It has a warm and lingering finish, very well balanced with soft tannins and a good acid balance. | \$29.50 |

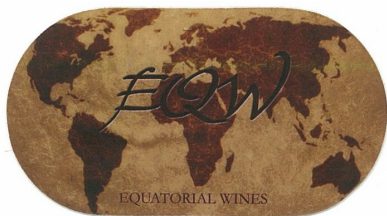

The wine is underpinned by powerful yet soft building tannins giving very good structure with well balanced acids and a very long finish.</p> <p>This wine is a perfect match for red meat dishes, hard cheeses or for simply enjoying at the end of a long day.</p> | \$35.50 |
| Barinia Clare Valley Cabernet Sauvignon 2008 | <p>The wine has a lifted fresh fruit aroma of blackberry and plum. Secondary characters of dark chocolate, dried herbs and spice add complexity to the bouquet.</p> <p>The wine has luscious red berry and cassis characters throughout the palate while subtle spice and dark chocolate characters add complexity. The mid-palate is soft and round with long elegant tannins and a velvety, persistent finish. 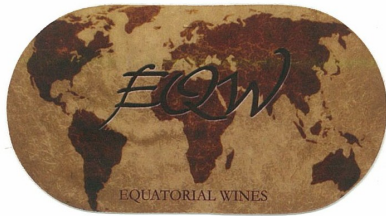

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| Pitchfork Semillon/Sauvignon Blanc 2011 | Classic lifted Semillon and Sauvignon Blanc aromas. Lemon/lime, gooseberry, pine needles, green mango and passion fruit with distinctive grassy edge. It is intensely flavoured, clean and zippy palate. Fresh fruit flavours of lemon, passionfruit and pineapple. The palate is long and lingering with a clean finish. | \$38.00 <i>90 Points</i> <i>J Halliday</i> |
| Pitchfork Chardonnay 2010 | Fermentation in stainless steel tank allows the full expression of Chardonnay fruit aroma without the influence of oak or lees resulting in a bright, clean tropical fruit bouquet. The palate is rich with tropical fruits, clean zippy acidity balances the sweet fruit character resulting in a bright fresh flavoursome palate. | \$38.00 |
| Pitchfork Cabernet Merlot 2009 | This traditional blend of the two classic grape varieties is designed to produce a wine with a complete palate profile. Cabernet Sauvignon is the structurally strongest variety with good flavour in the early and late part of the taste spectrum backed up by fine tannin. 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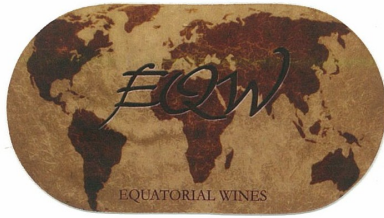

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| Hay Shed Hill Sauvignon Blanc - Semillon 2011 | Sauvignon Blanc and Semillon grapes from the Hay Shed Hill vineyard were used in making this wine. Only free run juice was used, this component of the juice is the highest in quality with the most intense fruit expression and the lowest in undesirable phenolic skin characters. Fermentation in stainless steel tanks at low temperature without the use of oak preserved and highlighted the finer fruit characters of these aromatic varieties. | \$42.50 <i>93 Points J Halliday</i> |
| Hay Shed Hill Chardonnay 2010 | The nose exhibits aromas of fresh cut pear and honey dew melon with some zesty citric notes. There are no overt woody or buttery aromas with the primary fruit characters expressed with clarity and definition. The palate is fresh and lively with clean crisp acidity complementing the vibrant fruity flavours. | \$45.50 <i>94 Points J Halliday</i> |
| Hay Shed Hill Cabernet Merlot 2010 | Deep crimson red of good intensity and vibrant hue. On the nose it has intense berry fruits, cassis and chocolate mint characters notes with background cedar like oak. Medium bodied this wine shows a vibrant and lively fruit driven palate with a fleshy middle and soft mature ripe tannin. The wine was matured in French oak barrels for 13 months . | \$42.50 <i>90 Points J Halliday</i> |
| Hay Shed Hill Cabernet 2009 | A dense dark red to black colour of great intensity. A rich bouquet led by the ripest cassis and berry fruits, rich and opulent but brooding in its youth. Behind the primary fruits are distinctive vineyard characteristics of dark chocolate and mint. 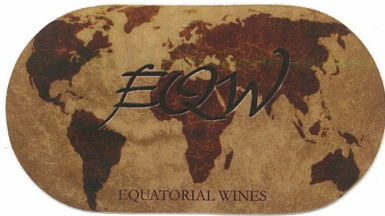

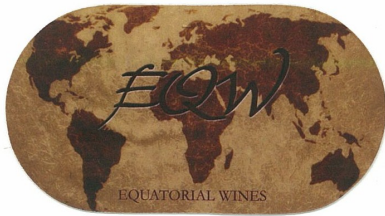
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| Block 6 Chardonnay 2010 | Mineral aromatics with background savoury flinty notes from the barrel fermentation. The fruit is in the fresh white pear spectrum with perhaps some citric elements. This is a fine Chardonnay that has a depth of flavour and beautiful texture. | \$65.50 <i>94 Points</i> <i>J Halliday</i> |
| Block 2 Cabernet 2009 | The wine has a dense blood red with a dark centre. The wine displays ripe berry aromas of great intensity with underlying dusty and earthy characters typical of Margaret River Cabernet Sauvignon. There is depth to the nose indicating there are reserves of complex aromas yet to develop and be exhibited in the wine. The palate is substantial – this is a big wine by Western Australian standards with intense and fully ripe, fleshy sweet fruit filling the mid palate with great palate extension driven by the ripe and mature tannin. | \$85.00 <i>95 Points</i> <i>J Halliday</i> |
| Kerrigan and Berry Riesling 2011 | The 2011 KERRIGAN + BERRY Riesling is the 2nd release of this wine, made from the historic Langton vineyard in Mt Barker in Western Australia's Great Southern. Planted in the early 70's, the Langton Vineyard has steep south facing slopes minimizing the impact of the summer sun, gravelly loam soils limiting vine potential and the cool climate conditions that ideally suit Riesling. The old vines produce low yields of intensely varietal Riesling with classic mineral and lime aromas with a brightness and vibrancy that is the hallmark of this style. These wines are delicious in their youth for the clarity and focus of their flavour and structure but have proven ability to age gracefully gaining complexity over time. | \$60.00 <i>95 Points</i> <i>J Halliday</i> |
| Kerrigan and Berry Cabernet Sauvignon 2008 | The 2008 KERRIGAN + BERRY Cabernet Sauvignon is made from two old vine vineyards situated in Mt Barker and Margaret River, the two premier grapegrowing regions of Western Australia. While Margaret River has earned an international reputation for this variety Mt Barker has quietly long produced Cabernets of great subtlety and complexity. Brick Kiln is a single varietal producer, focusing on making one of the best Shiraz from the famous McLaren Vale region in South Australia. The owners of Brick Kiln, the Mankinnons aim is to make a McLaren Vale shiraz the equal of Fox Creek Reserve (of who they were foundation partners) but without the enormous price tag. The Brick Kiln name derived from Brick Kiln Bridge along Almond Grove Road approaching the vineyard. The eight hectare (20 acres) Nine Gums Vineyard nestles under the rolling Willunga Hills.

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| Brick Kiln Shiraz 2008 | <p>A deep purple colour, this wine has aromas of luscious berries, dark plums and spice. On the palate berry and plum fruit predominate, with hints of licorice, caramel and spicy pepper. The soft fruit tannins reach to the mid palate with a long lasting aftertaste. The wine was matured in oak hogsheads (30% new, 20% French) for 18 months before bottling in October 2009.</p> <p>★★★★ Winestate Magazine</p> | <p>\$60.00</p> <p>90 Points J Halliday</p> |
| Brick Kiln 'The Grove' Reserve Shiraz 2008 | <p>This wine was selected from the 2008 Brick Kiln Shiraz matured in French Oak hogsheads for 18 months. The best six barrels were put together as "The Grove" and described by James Halliday (Australian Wine Companion 2010) as "The Grove 2008 - here the best six french oak barrels (largely new) were selected, giving this full-bodied wine a distinct point of difference from the varietal, both in flavour and texture terms; while still rich, ripe and opulent, the black fruits have better definition. Rating 93 points - drink to 2023"</p> <p>The wine is deep purple, rich in berry and plum fruit with chocolate overtones and a peppery spiciness. 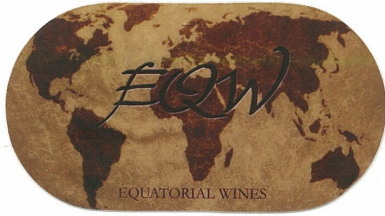
